What is a Supported Internship?

The Shaw Trust Supported Internship is a study programme aimed at young people aged 16 to 24 who have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) and want to move into employment but need some extra support. Our internship usually lasts for a year, with the opportunity to complete three different placements. Supported Internships give young people an opportunity to take their first steps into the world of employment, build skills in the workplace, gain qualifications, and get a paid job.

The internships offer a unique mix of education and job coaching in a range of different roles, including:



Interns can expect a programme of learning that helps them develop the skills they need for work, such as job-specific skills, employability skills and qualifications – including Functional Skills Maths and English – and broader personal and social skills.

A job coach will help source suitable jobs, arrange work trials and develop opportunities with employers.



Upon completion of the Supported Internship, we provide three months of transitional support to help move interns into paid employment.

Our team connect interns with local employers, and facilitate visits, trials, selection, and transitional support into employment.

We will continue to support the young person once they have moved into paid employment through the Access to Work funding. This allows us to access an 'in-work' mentor to provide support and ensure the newly employed young person makes a successful transition into paid working life.

Paid employment

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Hear from our supported interns



When Max joined the internship, he had very little confidence and was experiencing anxiety in everyday life, often struggling to talk to peers. Max was unsure of what he wanted to do for a career and had no previous work experience. Supported by his job coach Max undertook three placements, two based within an office and one with Transport for London. During his time working with TfL. Max developed a passion for working in the rail industry. Max was supported to apply for a role with South Western Railway. This involved application support and interview preparation. Max was successful and received a job with the company.

"During the internship through Shaw Trust I gained more confidence which allowed me to enjoy meeting new people and making new friends. I learnt a lot of new skills which I will be able to use in the future. I have improved my social skills and confidence and got myself a job as a result which I'm really happy about!"

Not only has Will gained valuable experience through the Supported Internship programme, he has also really enjoyed his work placements. After some encouragement from his Mum he signed up, and he hasn't looked back since. Lily had an ambition to work in Early Years Education. Her first placement on the internship was at Bear Hugs Day Nursery where she worked four days a week with the team, learning the processes within the organisation. Gradually, Lily undertook additional hours to support the team, demonstrating her dedication and commitment. The managers at the nursery expressed what an asset to the team Lily was and shared that they would like to begin the process of employing Lily. Once she had completed her qualification Lily was employed as a paid Nursery Nurse with Bear Hugs Nursery.
